

A Message From Your President Spike Unruh

Greetings everyone,

am glad to have 2020 behind us. Unfortunately, there was no magic reset button to return us to "normal" life, and it still looks like the journey towards returning to normal will be long.

Washington State is in currently in legislative session, and we have seen a swarm of law enforcement bills that are genuinely concerning. The Washington State Troopers Association has been working hard to educate legislators on department policies and procedures, the job we perform, and the effects of proposed legislation on our members and the citizens we serve. Several bills mirror department policies we already have in place. However, other bills will have serious repercussions affecting the safety of law enforcement officers and the citizens we serve and protect. We have even seen bills proposed in committee that will not pass constitutional muster. Unfortunately, this will be a battle for law enforcement that will not be over anytime soon.

Washington. Steve had such a huge impact on us all, and my heart still hurts.

Details of the incident will be handled by Kittitas County Sheriff's Office. We extend our heartfelt thanks to all who were involved in helping Steve, including the Kittitas County Sheriff's office and members of Kittitas County Search and Rescue.

Police 1 has also posted the loss of Steve on their website.

Our thoughts and prayers are with his wife Laurie, the rest of the family, his friends, immediate coworkers, and the rest of us as we all process the loss of a wonderful father, husband, friend and member of our WSP family.



A Message From Your Chief John R. Batiste

ecently, after further investigation and review, Trooper Renee Padgett's 2018 passing was officially recognized as a Line of Duty Death. This decision will enable us to make sure she receives the tributes and honors deserved, and that her family is supported in a manner befitting her sacrifice. Her memory will be entered into the official history of our organization along with the other 30 brave men and women who have paid the ultimate sacrifice, having served our state, agency and profession with distinction.

Renee's name will be formally dedicated in the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial in Washington, DC on May 13, 2021, at the 33rd Annual Candlelight Vigil, during National Police Week. The Behind the Badge Foundation is engraving her name to the Washington State Law Enforcement Memorial in Olympia, and her name will also be added to our WSP Memorial at the Academy in Shelton. Renee's name has already been added to the Fallen Heroes section of the WSP website and our centennial commemorations.

The Washington State Patrol Memorial Foundation will be escorting her wife, Marcella to each of the three commemorations — in Olympia, Shelton, and in Washington DC. In addition, the Behind the Badge Foundation will be honoring Renee in both their live and virtual presentations throughout this year's commemorations.

This year, National Police Week begins on Sunday, May 9th, and ends Saturday, May 15th. Pandemic restrictions are still in place, but we are hopeful we will have the opportunity to offer appropriate and customary honors.

Renee passed away on September 4, 2018, following a long and courageous battle with cancer. At the request of her family and with the full support of the Washington State Patrol, an extensive review of her service history was conducted. Careful forensic review determined the cause of her cancer was exposure to highly toxic chemicals as a result of an extensive agency investigation into illegal auto wrecking years earlier.

Renee served the Washington State Patrol and the citizens of Washington State for 27 years. She is survived by her wife, Marcella Egan, her children Gedeon Rene Padgett Lagasse and Olivia Rochelle Padgett Lagasse, and her sisters Nicole A. Cook of Kennewick, Washington and Jaclyn L. Padgett of Boise, Idaho. Renee's family is our family and we will continue to support them.

The courage with which Renee faced her illness inspired us and will forever remain a memory. The announcement regarding the reclassification of her cause of death status has been widely covered by both local and national media, leading to renewed attention to the issue of environmental hazards in the workplace. That additional attention will support the continuing efforts for clean-up and hazards mitigation and be part of improving public safety – perhaps the most fitting tribute to the life and sacrifice of Renee.

We will continue to honor our friend and trooper by facing each day with caution, care, and with Renee Padgett-like courage.



A Report From Your Lobbyist **Davor Gjurasic**

2021 Virtual Legislative Session Update **Davor Gjurasic, Lobbyist, WSPTA**

ue to COVID-19 the 2021 Legislative Session is being conducted totally virtually. Only a handful of legislators and staff are allowed on the legislative campus to facilitate the daily operations of the House and Senate. All other members and staff are participating from home. The general public and lobbyists are not allowed on campus either.

This has caused some interesting dynamics in all virtual public hearings and member meetings. The number of bills introduced has been cut back significantly, and I predict that there will be quite a bit fewer bills in the end that will make it all the way through the process.

The ability of both legislators and lobbyists, hoping to influence the outcomes of legislation, to meet face-to-face is being greatly hampered and is leading to limited input from all. As I write this article on the 41st day of the 105-day session, zoom fatigue has set in among all involved.

That being said, the 2021 session has seen more policy bills dealing with policing reform than ever before. If passed, these bills will change the way law enforcement conducts itself for years to come.

To better engage legislators on these numerous policing policy bills, the WSPTA has formed a law enforcement coalition including several groups that represent peace officers: Teamsters, Federation of State Employees, and WACOPS, to name a few. To date we have had incremental success in amending some of the bills we have concerns with as well as in supporting ones which will have a positive impact on peace officers.

Bills with which we currently have the most concerns:

SHB1054 Establishing requirements for tactics and equipment used by peace officers.


Prohibits peace officers from using chokeholds and neck restraints.

Prohibits peace officers from using police dogs to arrest or apprehend persons.

Prohibits law enforcement agencies from acquiring or using tear gas and certain types of military equipment.

Requires law enforcement agencies to adopt policies and procedures to ensure that uniformed peace officers are reasonably identifiable.

Establishes restrictions on vehicular pursuits and firing upon moving vehicles.

Prohibits a peace officer from seeking, and a court from issuing, a search or arrest warrant granting an express exception to the "knock and announce" rule.

SHB1202 Addressing meaningful civil remedies for persons injured as a result of police misconduct, including by allowing for an award of attorney fees in addition to damages and injunctive and declaratory relief.

Provides a cause of action for a person injured in person or property by a peace officer acting under color of authority if the officer engaged in specifically listed conduct and requires an award of actual damages and costs and attorneys' fees to a prevailing plaintiff.

Authorizes the Attorney General to investigate employers and peace officers engaging in a pattern or practice of conduct in violation of the act and to bring a civil action against a peace officer or employer to restrain and prevent the peace officer or employer from engaging in the pattern or practice of conduct.

SHB1267 Concerning investigation of potential criminal conduct arising from police use of force, including custodial injuries, and other officer-involved incidents.

Establishes the Office of Independent Investigations within the Office of the Governor for the purpose of investigating deadly force incidents involving peace officers.

SHB1310 Concerning permissible uses of force by law enforcement and correctional officers.

Establishes a standard for use of physical force by peace officers.

SSB5051 Concerning state oversight and accountability of peace officers and corrections officers.

Modifies the priorities and composition of the Criminal Justice Training Commission (CJTC).

Expands the background investigation requirements for persons applying for peace officer, reserve officer, and corrections officer positions.

Expands the conduct for which the certification of a peace officer or a corrections officer may be revoked.

Requires employing agencies to report all separation and disciplinary matters regarding a certified officer to the CJTC.

Removes confidentiality of complaints, investigations, and disciplinary actions for certified officers and requires information be maintained on a publicly searchable database.

Bills that we support:

SHB1089 Concerning compliance audits of requirements relating to peace officers and law enforcement agencies.

Authorizes the State Auditor to review a deadly force investigation to determine whether the involved actors complied with all applicable rules and procedures.

Authorizes the State Auditor, upon the request of the Criminal Justice Training Commission, to review a law enforcement agency to ensure compliance with all applicable rules and procedures governing the training and certification of the agency's peace officers.

SHB1092 Concerning law enforcement data collection.

Requires the Washington State University (WSU) to establish a program to collect, report, and publish information on law enforcement's use of force and other interactions with and incidents involving the public.

Requires all general and limited authority law enforcement agencies to participate in the program by collecting and reporting certain information to the WSU.

2SSB5066 Concerning a peace officer's duty to intervene.

Requires a peace officer to intervene when the officer witnesses a fellow peace officer engaging in the use of excessive force.

Requires a peace officer who observes wrongdoing by a fellow officer to report the wrongdoing to the officer's supervisor.

Requires law enforcement agencies to adopt written policies on the duty to intervene and ensure that all law enforcement officers obtain training on the policy through the Criminal **Justice Training Commission.**

SSB5259 Concerning law enforcement data collection.

Requires the Attorney General's Office establish an advisory group to make recommendations for implementation of a program for statewide data collection, reporting, and publication of use of force data.

Directs the advisory board to conduct a competitive bid process to select a university to design, develop, and manage the data collection program.

Requires that no later than July 1, 2022, all law enforcement agencies must report all instances of the use of force to the university on a quarterly basis.

The Award of Honor is the highest award presented, recognizing an outstanding act of valor where employees perform a hazardous act at extraordinary risk to their lives.

The Medal of Courage is the second highest award presented to an enforcement member who, while performing in the line of duty, is confronted with or involved in an extremely hazardous event in order to accomplish a legitimate police objective.

Award of Honor

TROOPER BRENT DELL - August 8, 1999, for heroic actions in attempting to rescue a 14-year-old drowning victim.

MR. MATTHEW SCOTT - October, 1997, for risking his safety in the water to rescue an accident victim.

TROOPER MAURICE M. GOODALL - May 29, 1995, for heroic actions in effecting the rescue of a 12-year-old drowning victim.




TROOPER DANIEL R. TINDALL - June 25, 1993, for actions on the Evergreen Point Floating Bridge where a Department of Transportation employee had been shot at and others threatened.

SERGEANT RONALD J. O'GWIN - April 13, 1983, for apprehension of a prisoner and release of a hostage in an armed confrontation while under fire.

TROOPER RICHARD B. HAWLEY - April 13, 1983, for apprehension of a prisoner and release of a hostage in an armed confrontation while under fire.

TROOPER JASON M. LINN - February 1999, for courageous actions after being shot by an armed aggressor.

LIEUTENANT STEVEN T. JEWELL; SERGEANT GREGORY E. MILLER; TROOPERS BRYANT BLAKE; DARIN F. DERUWE; MARK A. HAAS; JOSEPH A. MAJ; MICHAEL S. MURPHY; H. LEE SLEMP; RICHARD A. TAYLOR; AND WAYNE E. TURNER – May 1998, for courage, resolve, and restraint exercised in the face of overwhelming force during the Washington State University riot on May 3, 1998.

TROOPERS DAVID R. CLIFTON AND DAWN M. NOETZEL -August 1998, for heroic actions and risk to personal safety while assisting in the apprehension of an armed, combative suspect on December 20, 1997.

TROOPER CHARLES P. LEBLANC - November 15, 1996, for efforts to safely apprehend a fleeing subject, who during the arrest process, attempted to take Trooper LeBlanc's life, which required Trooper LeBlanc to respond with appropriate lethal force in self-defense.

SERGEANT WILLIAM B. GARDINER – January 27, 1996, for performance in the line of duty during a life-threatening confrontation with an armed suspect.

TROOPER KENT H. HITCHINGS - August 1994, for courageous actions during an incident with an armed, unstable aggressor.

TROOPER GARY J. TURICK – 1987, for heroic actions in the line of duty and risk to personal safety while apprehending a dangerous armed suspect on SR 503.





Never Forget



Vernon Fortin September 30, 1923

Trooper Vernon Fortin died on September 30, 1923, at the age of 25. Trooper Fortin was injured when his motorcycle collided with another patrolman's motorcycle while they were en route to the Lynden fair for traffic duty. Trooper Fortin died five days later from his injuries. At the time of his death, Trooper Fortin served 18 months with the Washington State Patrol.



Irving Thorsvig October 26, 1926

Trooper Irving Thorsvig was westbound on his motorcycle on August 29, 1926, on the old Bothell-Seattle highway when he slipped on the brick surface. A handle bar struck him in the chest. At first, it was believed to be a minor chest injury, then perhaps a bruised lung. It developed into a serious lung problem. His mother took him to Los Angeles, but he died October 26, 1926, before reaching a sanitarium. Trooper Irving had served nine months with the Washington State Patrol.



Conrad Tolson March 24, 1929

Trooper Conrad Tolson died on March 24, 1929, at the age of 39. He died from injuries sustained the previous day in a collision between his motorcycle and an oncoming automobile on the Seattle-Tacoma highway near the Pierce-King County line. Trooper Tolson was southbound on the Seattle-Tacoma highway when an oncoming car veered into his lane. Trooper Tolson's motorcycle and sidecar collided with the oncoming vehicle.



Douglas Cossman October 9, 1929

Trooper H. Douglas Cossman died on October 9, 1929, at the age of 28. He died from injuries he received in a collision with an automobile and his motorcycle at 46th & Park Avenue in Tacoma. At the time of his death, Trooper Cossman had served only two months with the Washington State Patrol as a trooper.





William Pautzke

May 8, 1930

Trooper William Pautzke died on May 8, 1930, at the age of 28. He died from injuries when he ran his motorcycle into the side of a gravel truck in the Burien area of Seattle en route to an investigation. At the time of his death, Trooper Pautzke served four years with the Washington State Patrol.



Captain Loren (Bud) Ray

December 16, 1934

Captain Loren Ray died on December 16, 1934, at the age of 34. Captain Ray died from injuries sustained in a fall at the County/City building in Seattle. At the time of his death, Captain Ray served six years with the Washington State Patrol.



Allen Ludden

March 15, 1938

Trooper Allen Ludden died on March 15, 1938, at the age of 37. He was fatally injured when he lost control of his motorcycle south of the Seattle city limits at a weigh station on the Seattle-Tacoma highway. At the time of his death, Trooper Ludden had served 18 months with the Washington State Patrol.



John Gulden

December 23, 1942

Trooper John Gulden died on December 23, 1942, at the age of 43. Trooper Gulden was shot as he approached a vehicle he stopped for driving without headlights. (He was unaware the vehicle had two teenage suspects inside wanted for robbery and car theft.) At the time of his death, Trooper Gulden served 13 years with the Washington State Patrol.



Thomas Hanlin

May 26, 1945

Trooper Thomas Hanlin died on May 26, 1945, at the age of 38. He died from injuries sustained 18 months after flipping his paddy wagon on the Mount Baker Highway near Deming. His injuries at first were considered minor bruises. Later diagnosis revealed head injury.





Paul Johnson December 12, 1949

Trooper Paul Johnson died on December 12, 1949, at the age of 32. Trooper Johnson died of a gunshot wound to the head after responding to a neighborhood disturbance near Snoqualmie. At the time of his death, Trooper Johnson served three years with the Washington State Patrol.



Ivan Belka August 18, 1951

Trooper Ivan Belka died on August 18, 1951, at the age of 38. A vehicle failed to yield to Trooper Belka's paddy wagon. He died from injuries as a result of this collision which occurred in Spokane. At the time of his death, Trooper Belka served 8½ years with the Washington State Patrol.



Don Campbell
December 21, 1951

Trooper Don Campbell Jr. died on December 21, 1951, at the age of 28. Trooper Campbell was struck by a truck while directing traffic around a stalled truck on Pacific Highway near Vancouver. At the time of his death, Trooper Campbell served six years with the Washington State Patrol.



John Wright

June 28, 1953

Trooper John Wright was commissioned September 10, 1951, in the 16th cadet class. He was assigned to the Spokane Valley detachment. Wright died June 28, 1953, of injuries after he was struck by a hit-and-run driver on East Sprague Avenue at Barker Road in Greenacres, east of Spokane. He was 28 years old.



Gene Bolstad September 3, 1957

Trooper Gene Bolstad died on September 3, 1957, at the age of 29 attempting to rescue a teenage boy in the surf at Long Beach. Both were caught in an undertow. At the time of his death, Trooper Bolstad had served 2½ years with the Washington State Patrol.





Ernest Eichhorn September 16, 1958

Trooper Ernest Eichhorn died on September 16, 1958, at the age of 33. He was killed by a drunk driver while directing traffic in front of the Puyallup Fairgrounds during the Western Washington Fair. At the time of his death, Trooper Eichhorn had served twelve years with the Washington State Patrol as a trooper.



Wes Whittenberg

December 29, 1960

Trooper Wesley Whittenberg died on December 29, 1960, at the age of 29. He was struck by a car while investigating an accident on the Stillaguamish River Bridge on U.S. 99 north of Marysville. At the time of his death, Trooper Whittenberg had served 10 years with the Washington State Patrol as a trooper.



Clarence Johnson

September 8, 1968

Trooper Clarence Johnson died on September 8, 1968, at the age of 26. He was killed when he was hit head-on by a pickup that crossed the center line on a curve between Fall City and Carnation. At the time of his death, Trooper Johnson had served 18 months with the Washington State Patrol.



Frank Noble February 5, 1972

Trooper Frank Noble died on February 5, 1972, at the age of 42. He was shot during a traffic stop near Toppenish by a furloughed convict who earlier had robbed a convenience store. At the time of his death, Trooper Noble had served 14 years with the Washington State Patrol.



Joseph Modlin

August 15, 1974

Weight Control Officer Joseph Modlin died on August 15, 1974, at the age of 60. He was killed when he was struck By a logging truck trailer while walking toward a second truck at the Home Valley weigh station on Highway 14, seven miles east of Stevenson. At the time of his death, Officer Modlin had served six years with the Washington State Patrol.





Thomas Hendrickson

November 17, 1974

Trooper Thomas Hendrickson died on November 17, 1974, at the age of 31. Trooper Hendrickson was struck and killed by a hit-and-run driver while investigating a traffic accident on State Route 20 in Mount Vernon. At the time of his death, Trooper Hendrickson had served almost four years with the Washington State Patrol.



Glenda Thomas

May 24, 1985

Trooper Glenda Thomas died on May 24, 1985, at the age of 29. She was killed while investigating a multivehicle collision on the north Seattle freeway. Trooper Thomas was standing between two vehicles at the collision scene when another car rear-ended one of the vehicles involved in the earlier collision, pinning her between two automobiles. At the time of her death, Trooper Thomas had served only six months with the Washington State Patrol as a trooper.



James Gain

March 2, 1987

Trooper James Gain died on March 2, 1987, at the age of 42. He was struck by a semi-truck along Interstate 5 seven miles north of Vancouver while conducting a traffic stop. At the time of his death, Trooper Gain had served 19 years with the Washington State Patrol.



Clifford Hansell

July 22, 1987

Trooper Clifford Hansell was killed July 22, 1987, at the age of 25. His patrol car collided broadside with the front of a semi-truck on North Central Avenue in downtown Kent as he swerved while responding to a collision scene. At the time of his death, Trooper Hansell had served 17 months with the Washington State Patrol.



Raymond Hawn

January 17, 1990

Trooper Raymond Hawn died on January 17, 1990, at the age of 47 when he was struck by a vehicle while rendering assistance to a motorcyclist who had run out of gas alongside Highway 12 near Grandview. At the time of his death, Trooper Hawn served 21 years with the Washington State Patrol.





Steven Frink March 22, 1993

Trooper Steven Frink died on March 22, 1993, at the age of 39. Trooper Frink was thrown from his motorcycle on an Interstate 90 off-ramp on Mercer Island when an automobile he was pursuing spun out of control. Trooper Frink died from his injuries four days after the collision.



James Saunders

October 7, 1999

Trooper James Saunders died on October 7, 1999, at the age of 31 from gunshot wounds while conducting a traffic stop in Pasco. At the time of his death, Trooper Saunders had served 8 ½ years with the Washington State Patrol as a trooper.



Tony Radulescu

February 23, 2012

Trooper Tony Radulescu died on February 23, 2012, at the age of 44. Trooper Radulescu was killed during a routine traffic stop on SR 16.



Sean O'Connell

May 31, 2013

Trooper Sean O'Connell was killed in the line of duty on May 31, 2013, when his motorcycle was stuck by a box truck in Skagit County.



Brent Hanger "Winky"

August 6, 2015

Trooper Detective Brent Hanger "Winky" began his career with the Washington State Patrol on July 9, 1998, On August 1, 2007, Brent joined the Northwest Regional Drug Task Force as a Trooper Detective assigned to Bellingham. Trooper Detective Brent Hanger died in the line of duty on August 6, 2015, when he suffered a heart attack while on duty in Yakima County during a marijuana ERAD mission. At the time of his death Trooper Detective Brent Hanger had served over 17 years with the Washington State Patrol.





Justin R. Schaffer March 24, 2020

Trooper Justin R. Schaffer, Badge #646, was killed in the line of duty on March 24, 2020, at the age of 28, after serving seven years with the Washington State Patrol. Trooper Schaffer was intentionally struck by a vehicle that was attempting to elude the police and troopers. Trooper Schaffer was deploying spike strips, at the time, down on Interstate 5 in Chehalis when he was hit.

Drug Recognition Experts Are Being Used In Mental Health Evaluations

he Drug Recognition Expert (DRE) programs has been around since the 1980's. It originated from the Los Angeles Police Department. Los Angeles Police Department officers Sergeant Richard Studdard (retired) and Detective Len Leeds (deceased) were instrumental in the development and qualification of the program. The DRE evaluation was a huge change in how officers looked at impairment.

Over the years the Drug Recognition Program has continued to use the standards used by these trend setting officers. The program has been recognized and is accepted in courtrooms across the country.

A couple of years ago Washington State mandated that all officers needed to advance their knowledge on mental health and de-escalation. I was scheduled to attend an 8hr course in Moses Lake. The class was taught by a Mental Health professional from King County.

During our training we were shown videos of people having Mental Health episodes. We were then asked to pick a possible disorder. During these videos I was surprised at how many looked like impaired people we deal with on a regular basis.

I asked the instructor if she knew what the neurologicals were on the people, pupil size, pulse rate, etc. I remember her looking at me with a confused look and saying, no one has ever asked that before. We later had a conversation on what a DRE does. That conversation got me thinking about what we are missing. Since then I have taken multiple hours of metal health training and have crossed trained in the Mental Health Community, asking the same questions.

Over the years officers have looked at people and either said, "They are nuts" or "They are high," but how do you

tell between the two? This got me researching Mental Health Disorders and more details into Impairment as well as the combination of the two. Things we don't often hear are "Therapeutic on Illicit drugs." This is like the ".20 drunk" who needs his alcohol to just get up in the morning. Any substance can take the place of alcohol; Heroin, Methamphetamines, Coffee, energy drinks, tobacco, shopping, just to name a few.

Mental health can affect all of us and should be taken seriously but how can you tell if the motorist is mental or high? Using the 12-step process of the

DRE program sets the base line. We treat what we see and try to answer that. You smell alcohol you assume they have been drinking alcohol right? You see Nystagmus and no odor then you assume they are on a drug right?

Using the DRE process is the same. A DRE will walk through their 12 steps and reach a conclu-

sion of seven drug categories or two other options, not impaired or medical rule out.

Medical rule out is where we, DRE's, can change things up. Mental Health Professionals use a reference book called the Diagnostic and Statistical Manuel (DSM-5). This book out lines Mental Health categories and indicators of the disorders. Mental Health Professionals will also evaluate the person with several pages of question asking lifestyle, family history, etc. This evaluation is after a medical screen from a medical doctor. The interesting thing is that a drug screen is not always done. If the person does not want one then they don't have to do one, or if the history shows a certain mental health disorder, then Mental Health Professionals assume it's the same disorder. Medical evaluations do not interpret


impairment just overall medical condition of the patients, enter the DRE.


The DRE has a very high accuracy rate. Most DRE's have a 95% or greater accuracy rate when determining a drug category. Pairing the DRE's finding with the mental evaluation gives the Mental Health Provider a better picture of the patient. This in turn gives the DRE more advanced knowledge in the Mental Health field and better understanding of the roadside impaired person.


How this works in the field is a different approach to patient care as well as prosecution. The object is to curb the reoccurring offender. Presently we deal with a "medical rule out" not impaired see you later. This is not an acceptable result and puts the person right back on the street so another officer can deal with them. Yakima County has a diversional prosecution program that has been successful. Pairing the DRE with Mental Health Professionals gives the court system options. I was recently asked to speak with Yakima County Commissioners on behalf of the Yakima County Court System. The Yakima Court System was very interested in the DRE/Mental Health approach and wanted to present this to the County Commissioners for future funding. The work has also reached national programs such as NHTSA and National DEC programs. I have presented to medical staff as well and Mental Health training such as Crisis Intervention Training (CIT). I have also included this training in school presentations when looking at problem students. As well ambulance staff in their preliminary evaluations.


Traditionally we DRE's were encouraged to stay in our lane. Looking at how police work has evolved we as DRE's also must evolve. The Washington State Drug Recognition Program is leading this evolution with "thinking outside the box" Just like Sergeant Studdard and Detective Leeds we are setting a new course in how we operate for the better of the community.

Blade-Tech WRS Level 2 Duty Holster with Tac-Light

By Johnny Mabry

ello, today the Charlie Mike Project shares its review of the WRS Level 2 Duty Holster with Tac-Light. I have been a long-time user of Blade-Tech and was really looking forward to trying out the WRS Level 2 Holster.

The WRS Level 2 Duty Holster with Tac-Light is a black thermoplastic molded duty holster. The one I received was level 2 retention with spring-loaded thumb release for a Glock-17. It included a drop-down leg shroud for tactical use and included a quick attachment system to a duty belt or leg shroud. The hol-

ster retails for \$124.99 from Blade-Tech. The price is comparable with other tac-holsters on the market.

Like most things Blade-Tech makes, this holster is very attractive. It has clean lines; a satin black finish and all edges are finished nicely. The WRS has a satin, slightly smooth finish that allows a good grip when donning and doffing the holster. The holster material is light weight, while being structurally strong and does not

feel flimsy. The edges are finished and matched nicely with no rough edges. The thumb release is firm with a crisp fast release. I like this thumb break! It is fast, very fast and locking the weapon in simply requires

rotating the hood back in place. The Thermoplastic is very durable and resists rough wear, scratches, the environment and chemicals easily. It was easily cleaned with water, dish soap and a rag.

I found the WRS holster to be comfortable, even on long days at the range and on duty. The adjust-

ment system was easy and fast. The leg shroud was somewhat rigid and would benefit from molding or shaping to better fit the leg. The straps were not as strong as I expected but were adequate for the occasional user.

The draw and re-holster were easy. The thumb release was easy to operate and very quick. The WRS is much faster than the traditional releases used by other manufacturers (i.e. press down and rotate forward). The

WRS system is intuitive and quick. Locking the weapon in the holster was easy. This is where I began to notice a problem. I will explain more below (see Retention).

The WRS holster is user friendly when adjusting the tension and position on your leg. WRS was easy to adjust and put on. Once positioned correctly the draw is natural. The included leg shroud was too ridged and did not conform to the shape of the



leg. Adjusting the retention of the holster was causing another issue. I will explain more below (see Retention).

Retention on the WRS is a molded adjustable pressure system that holds the light with an additional thumb release strap. Tension is adjustable by two tensioning screw located near the light and trigger guard. Tension adjustment was adequate and allowed for varying degrees of retention. However, retention was only on the light and not on the weapon. There is no actual retention on the weapon. This allowed the pistol to rock forward in the holster if the tension was not tight enough. If the tension was set tight enough to prevent rocking, the weapon became difficult to draw and holster and caused problems with the WRS mechanism releasing.

If the tension is set tight enough to prevent rocking, the WRS system lags. I found that I had almost a three second delay on some draws. That is a serious officer safety concern! If I pressed the weapon down impractically hard when holstering and drawing the lag decreased but did not go away. The problem was caused by the tension on the light preventing me from holstering the weapon all the way into the holster. I could not find a happy medium that allowed for a good seat of the weapon and prevented the thumb break lag.

Another problem I found was that you simply cannot holster your weapon without the light on it. If you try the weapon will simply flop around and fall out. When I first received the holster and noticed this problem I thought

that Blade-Tech had accidently sent me the wrong holster. I had received the holster for the Glock-17, but my Glock-21 fit perfectly. I spoke with my contact at Blade-Tech and was told I had received the correct holster and that the WRS is designed not to touch the weapon.

Officer Safety and Agency policy:

My agency police preclude using this holster. Retention must be on the weapon system and not only on an accessory attached to the weapon. Blade-Tech has added a retention strap and made this a "level 2" holster. Check your agency police if you are using this holster.

The thumb break over the weapon would lag and stall after the thumb release was pressed. No upward pressure was being

applied to the weapon. The weapon itself was not being toughed at all. This happened several times and will cause a safety issue.

Overall the WRS was light and comfortable. The leg shroud sits on the thigh but is very rigid and does not flex easily. The straps feel flimsy and do not have enough heft to pull the shroud snuggly around the leg. The holster material and finish are top notch and of a quality expected from Blade-Tech. As a longtime user of Blade-Tech products, I am pleased with the performance of the Eclipse OWB despite some issues and agency police limitations.

Honestly, unless Blade-Tech makes some serious design changes to the WRS, I would not recommend the WRS Level 2 Duty Holster with Tac-light to officers.

The retention system causes too many safety concerns for me. And if my light breaks or comes off for some reason I cannot holster my pistol. If that happens, I now have a useless brick on my hip and no place to holster my weapon.

I would recommend this holster to the casual and sports user but not for LE or Military applications.

I sent my suggestions and concerns to the Blade-Tech, but I have not seen a change in the WRS Level 2 Duty Holster with Tac-light.
